CHESTER COUNTY ART ASSOCIATION EARNS 100 POINTS AND BLUE RIBBON IN WEDNESDAY'S JUDGING AT THE PHILADELPHIA FLOWER SHOW.

In the second round of Flower Show judging on Wednesday, **CCAA received 100 points in the Tables Division and a blue ribbon!!** The Flower Show's theme this year is *Springtime in Paris*: CCAA's Parisian café table installation is an homage to Picasso and Cubism. The table is instantly recognizable as a Picasso Cubist composition—Picasso, of course, lived and worked in Paris. The installation features an amazing cubist chandelier created by Karen Delaney along with angular chairs by Alan Andersen, tableware by Susan Andersen and ceramic-artist Rhoda Kahler, a strikingly Picasso-esque floor covering created by Kim Sward, and an extraordinary floral display designed by Nancy Halladay. CCAA wishes to acknowledge all of the volunteers who gave their time and creativity to this project with special recognition to Joan Gibson whose help has been invaluable. The judges said the installation was "a true work of art."

CCCAA's installation—alongside the other Tables Division entrants—is near the back of the B Section at the Flower Show. The Flower Show continues through March 13, 2011 at the Philadelphia Convention Center.
